
Somewhere in the Kingdom of Fife ...

Two of the 2009 east Scotland released Whitetailed Eagles (part of the third phase of the Scottish reintroduction) have set up home together in Fife. *Turquoise 1*, the female, and *Turquoise Z*, the male, are so-called because of their respective turquoise coloured wing tags with identifying letter/number. They made history in 2013, raising the first Whitetailed Eagle chick in the east of Scotland for almost 200 years.

In 2014, another chick successfully fledged the

nest, proving what great parents 1 and Z are. Being a crucial and sensitive time for the Eagles, a Nest Watch team was set up to ensure there was no disturbance. During Nest Watch, it became apparent that, despite the Eagles' large size, they are incredibly sneaky birds. Plus, there were annoying branches, foliage and a tree obscuring the view to the nest, often only allowing brief, tantalising glimpses of the action! This is a record of the pair's 2014 nesting season.



























































Meanwhile, on the Isle of Mull ...

Mull's White-tailed Eagles have been busy this year too.




Let's catch up with a few of Mull's familiar Whitetailed Eagle residents and see what they've been up to during the nesting season.


Nest building was (reluctantly) getting underway for one pair of Eagles




Eagle Antics


